Office of Engagement's Mission

The Office of Engagement promotes welcoming environments in BPS, builds capacity for authentic engagement and supports effective partnerships among **students**, families, schools and the community to ensure student readiness and achievement from birth to graduation.

BPS and Youth on Board Partnership

- 2001 BPS-YOB Partnership launched
- YOB provides additional support through staffing and access to national organizations
- Shared responsibility for development of BSAC representatives

Purpose:

To interrupt the School to Prison Pipeline (STPP) by educating students and other educational stakeholders on the impacts and causes of the STPP

- Annual Listening Project as part of Dignity in School's Campaign National Week of Action Against School Pushout

Opportunity & Achievement Gap Task Force

Purpose:

To revise the existing Opportunity and Achievement gap policies for implementation in black and brown communities insuring student throughout BPS receive a quality and equitable education.

What BSAC is Doing:

 BSAC appointed two student representatives to provide youth voice on the task force

Next Steps and FY17 Goals:

- Maintain representation and youth voice in all aspects of the Opportunity and Achievement Gap policy implementation.
- Collaborate with Dr. Rose on the development of a BPS anti-racism statement

BPS Budget

Purpose:

Inform students about the next year's budget and how it will affect them

What BSAC is Doing:

- Budget Forum with BPS Finance Department and Dr. Chang
- Public Testimony at BPS Budget Cuts and Open Enrollment Meetings, City Council Hearings, and other forums
- Meetings with State Legislators, City Councilors, and Mayor
- BPS June 7th Student Forum on Budget

Next Steps and FY17 Goals:

Ensure adequate funding for schools and programs

SEL & Restorative Justice Circle Practice

Purpose:

SEL practices help students express their feelings and understand what others are going through so we can build strong relationships and work as a team.

What BSAC Has Done:

- Co-wrote Preparing Youth to Thrive SEL Book through Susan Crowne Foundation
- Peer Mentoring and Support Groups
- BSAC Retreat
- RJ Circle Training with BSAC Members
- Code of Conduct Advisory Council (COCAC) Restorative Practices in BPS

Next Steps and FY17 Goals:

- Conduct RJ Circle on Racism with BPS Executive Cabinet
- Work towards acceptance of SEL and Restorative Practices by all BPS schools.
- To have more students, staff, and administrators trained in these practices.

Climate Justice: Energy Audits

Purpose:

• To help BPS consider how it can save energy and therefore money and our planet. We must take action today – it's too easy not to.

BSAC Has Done:

- 16 BSAC students conducted unofficial energy audits of several school buildings including the Bruce Bolling. These audits bring awareness to a ominous problem and provide practical solutions.
- Identified critical information:
 - -70% of Boston's CO2 emissions come from buildings, of which 40% is from schools.
 - -Schools are huge sources of energy waste, have great potential to save money and help mitigate the effect of climate change.

Next Steps and FY17 Goals:

Have findings included in the facilities master plan process

Climate Justice: Science Curriculum Integration

Purpose:

• To support students with understanding the implications of climate change, as well as their role and ability to mitigate climate change.

BSAC Has Done:

- Surveyed teachers to identify educator needs around climate justice
- Conducted focus groups with teachers, administrators, and students to get feedback to inform the development of online learning modules

Next Steps and FY17 Goals:

• It is time to get creative! Over the summer BSAC will collaborate with teachers and the Science Department of BPS to create eight teaching modules.


Student Rights & Responsibilities App
