Post Secondary Opportunities

- Choose to continue their education at colleges and universities, or pursue any combination of such.

Overview of Career Technical Education at MPTVHS

Industry Level Post Secondary Opportunities

- Additionally, students have the opportunity to participate in industry-based, real-work experiences through a cooperative education (co-op) program during their junior and senior year.
- Students must meet specific criteria that include daily attendance and grade point average in order to be eligible for co-op placement.

Admissions Criteria

All students that apply will gain admittance until the number of applicants selecting MPTVHS exceeds the enrollment level set for the incoming freshmen class.

Once the demand for seats exceeds capacity the selection criteria stated in the proposed Admissions Policy shall be utilized.
