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# SCHOOL SITE COUNCIL TRAINING MENU

The School Site Council plays a critical role in hiring of staff, reviews and advises on the budget, and can waive the provision of the collective bargaining agreement or any School Committee rule regulation.

## SSC 101: SSC BASICS & SHARED DECISION MAKING

NOV 19TH

This workshop focuses on the roles and responsibilities of the SSC in the school's decision-making process, including recent changes. Explore and master the foundational concepts needed to develop and maintain an effective School Site Council. Participants will also deepen their understanding of shared decision making principals and techniques and will receive tools to promote SSC success.

## SSC 102: SCHOOL SITE COUNCIL & BUDGET

NOV 24TH or DEC 1ST or DEC 3RD

This session focuses on the important role of the SSC in developing and approving the school's budget. School teams will learn about the BPS weighted student funding budget process, and get experience with building consensus.

## SSC 104: RECRUITING & RETAINING A DIVERSE COUNCIL

DEC 19TH OR JAN 7TH

Effective recruiting strategies are critical to developing a Council that reflects the diversity of the families and staff in the building – racial, ethnic and programmatic including ELL and students with disabilities.

## SSC 105: ENGAGING STUDENTS IN DECISION MAKING

DEC 15TH OR JAN 5TH

Student voice is a pivotal part of the high school SSC. Learn how to engage students as active participants and decision-makers; and to deepen students' understanding of their role and responsibility as a member of School Site Councils and Governing Boards.

## SSC 106: PERSONNEL SUBCOMMITTEE

JAN 21ST OR FEB 4TH

This session focuses on the roles and responsibilities of the SSC in selecting a Personnel Subcommittee to hire school staff; and provides support to ensure that the subcommittee works effectively.
