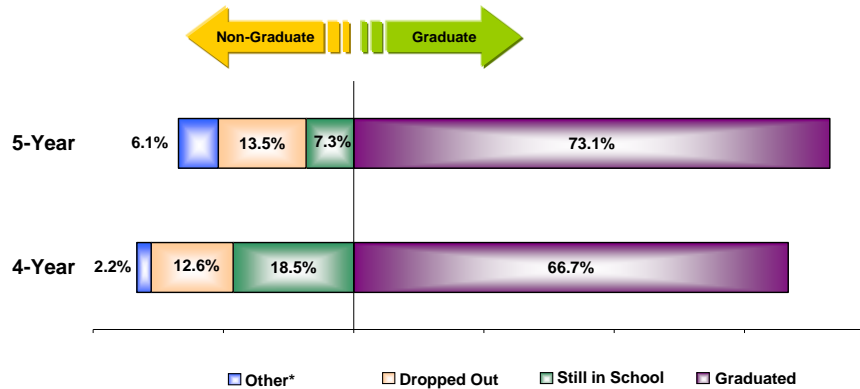

Cohort 2014 (N=4,335)** 4-Year vs 5-Year Graduation Rate

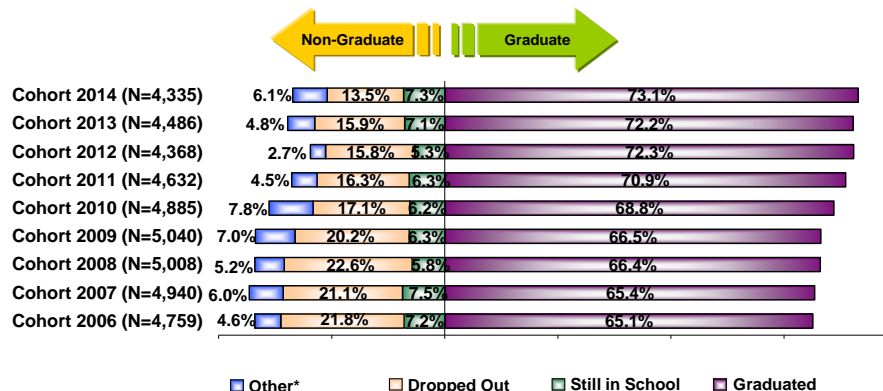

- With an additional year, the graduation rate for students who entered high school as freshmen in 2010 (the 2014 Cohort) increased 6.4 percentage points, from 66.7% (4-year graduation rate) to 73.1% (5-year graduation rate). The increase represents an additional 277 members of the 2014 cohort graduating from the BPS after an extra year in school.

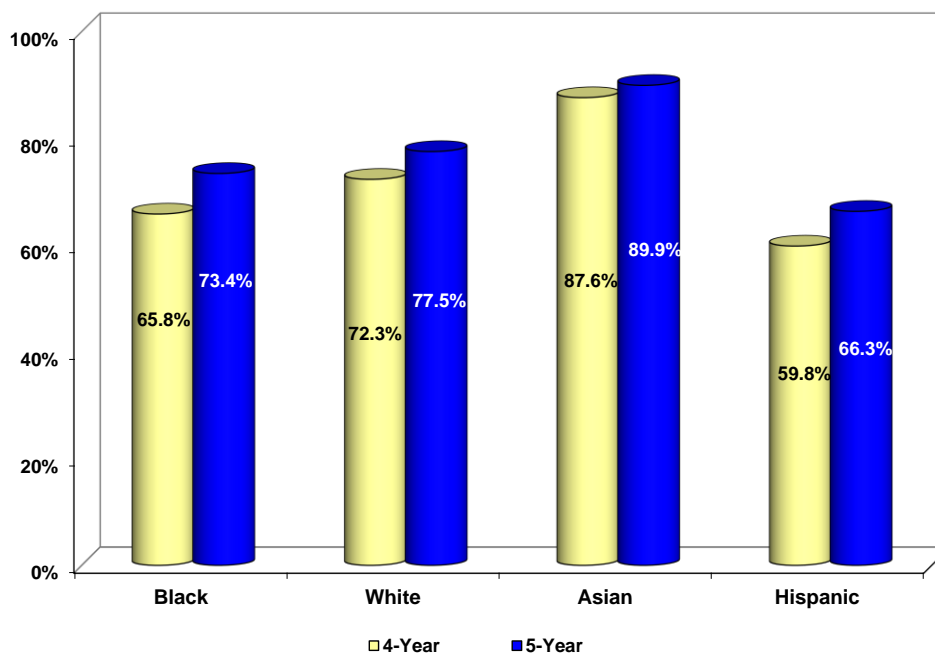
- Compared to the 2013 cohort, the 5-year graduation rate for the 2014 cohort increased by 0.9 percentage points to 73.1%, the highest since cohort 2006 (65.1%) when the graduation rate was first calculated. While the percentage of students still in school increased by 0.2 percentage points for the 2014 cohort (7.3%), the 5-year dropout rate decreased by 2.4-point to 13.5%, the lowest of the nine cohorts.

Detailed statistics for the 4-year versus 5-year graduation rate by student status for cohort 2014 can be found in Appendix A. Appendix B presents the 5-year graduation rate by student subgroup for Cohorts 2006 through 2014.

Cohort 2014 (N=4,335)** 4-Year vs 5-Year Graduation Rate By Race/Ethnicity

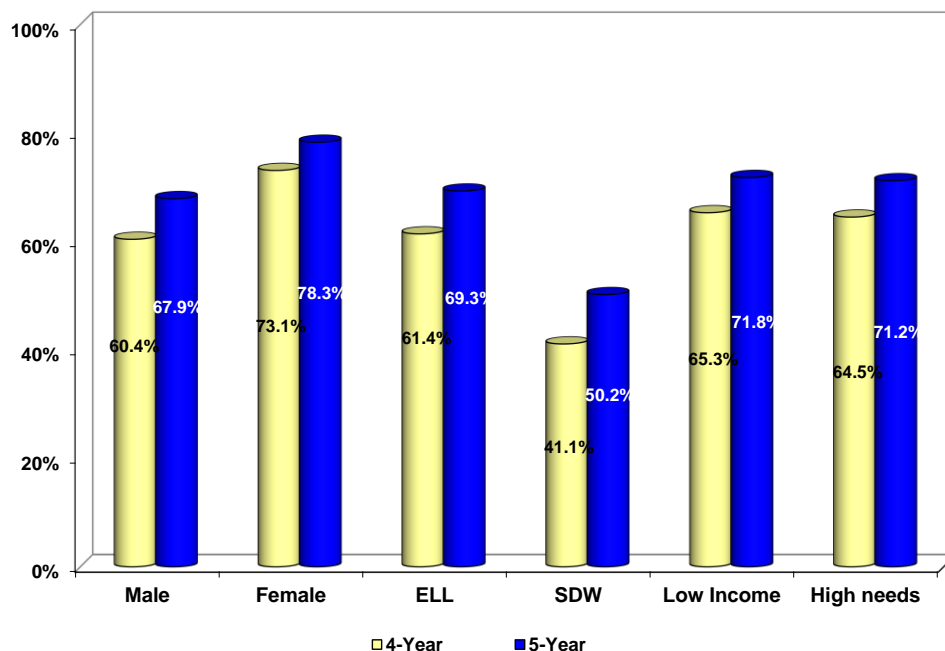


- All major racial/ethnic groups for the cohort of 2014 had higher 5-year rates compared to their 4-year rates. The additional year seems most beneficial to African American and Hispanic students, with each group seeing a 7.6-point and 6.5 point increase respectively (138 African American and 95 Hispanic students) in their 5-year graduation rates compared to the 4-year graduation rates; White students experienced a gain of 5.2 points (28 students); and Asian students gained 2.3 points (10 students).
- While gaps in the graduation rates among racial/ethnic groups remain, the graduation gap between Black and White students did narrow from 6.5 percentage points at the end of four years to 4.1 percentage points after five years. Similarly, the graduation gap between Hispanic and White students narrowed from 12.5 percentage points at the end of four years to 11.2 percentage points after five years.

- An additional year in high school benefited both male and female students: the 5-year graduation rate for males in the 2014 cohort increased by 7.5 percentage points compared to the 4-year rate. Similarly, female students saw a 5.2 percentage point increase in their graduation rate with the additional year.
- Of the 1,260 English language learners (ELLs) who were part of the 2014 cohort, 774 students (61.4%) graduated in 4 years. An additional 99 ELL students graduated after staying in school an extra year, resulting in the 69.3% 5-year graduation rate. The 5-year graduation rate for students with disabilities (SDW) climbed from 41.1% graduating within 4 years to a total of 50.2% with 5 years (or 78 additional students graduating). For low-income students, the 5-year rate was 6.5 points higher than the 4-year rate, with 237 additional students graduating; and the high needs students also saw a 6.7-point higher in their 5-year graduation rate than the 4-year rate, with 255 more students graduating.
- For the 2014 cohort, of all student groups, students with disabilities benefited the most with an additional year in high school: their 5-year graduation rate was up 9.1 percentage points, higher than any other group compared to the 4-year rate.

- With an additional year in high school, the percentage of students who graduated increased for all schools that met the sample size requirement. Community Academy of Science and Health (CASH) had the largest increase, 15.6 percentage points, from 57.8% (4-year graduation rate) to 73.4% (5-year graduation rate).
- In 2016, the 5-Year graduation rate target for both state and federal accountability purposes is 90% applied to the 2014 Cohort, a 5 percentage point increase from 85% in 2015. Based on the 5-year rate, seven high schools have met this requirement. However, only Boston Arts Academy would benefit from the 5-year rate because the other six schools have also met the 2016 4-year rate target of 85%.
