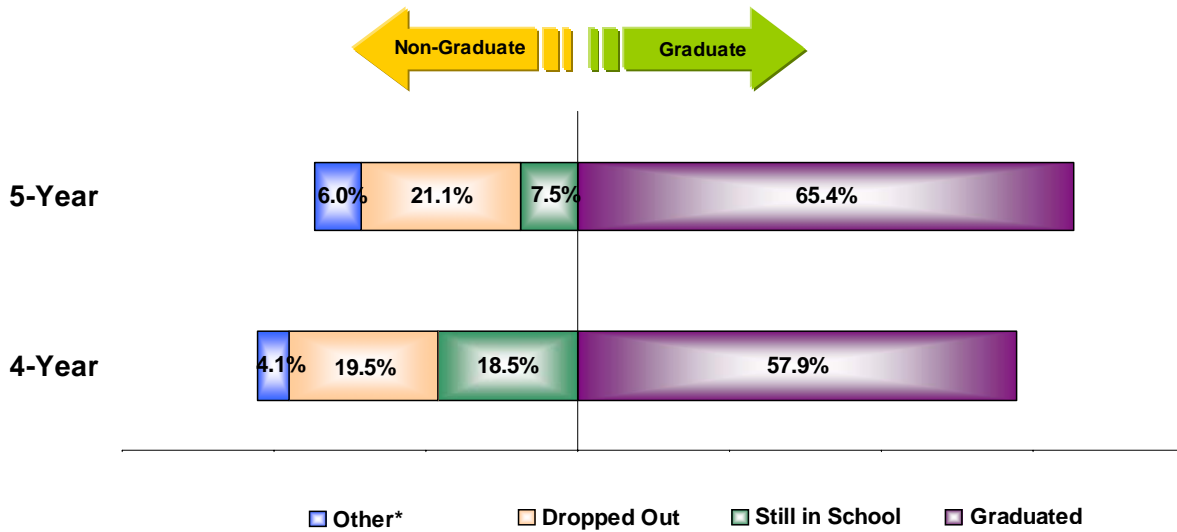

* Other: includes Non-Graduate Completers, GED and Expelled.

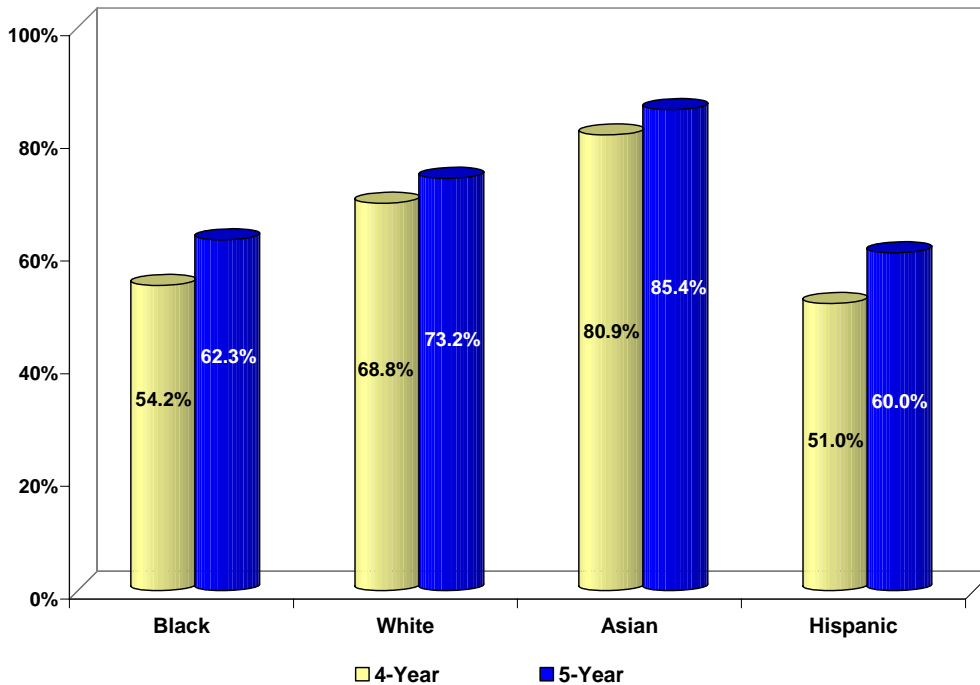
- With an additional year, the graduation rate for students who entered high school as freshmen in 2003 (the 2007 Cohort) increased 7.5 percentage points, from 57.9% (4-year graduation rate) to 65.4% (5-year graduation rate). The increase represents an additional 371 members of the 2007 cohort graduating from the BPS after an extra year in school.

** Cohort 2007 population: Students who were enrolled in BPS in grade 9 in the fall of 2003 plus transfers into BPS minus transfers out of BPS or deaths. The cohort count is as of the end of SY2006-07. The status (e.g., graduate, enrolled) is updated as of October 1, 2007 for the 4-Year graduation rate and is updated as of October 1, 2008 for the 5-year graduation rate.

Cohort 2007 (N=4,940)** 4-Year vs 5-Year Graduation Rate By Race/Ethnicity



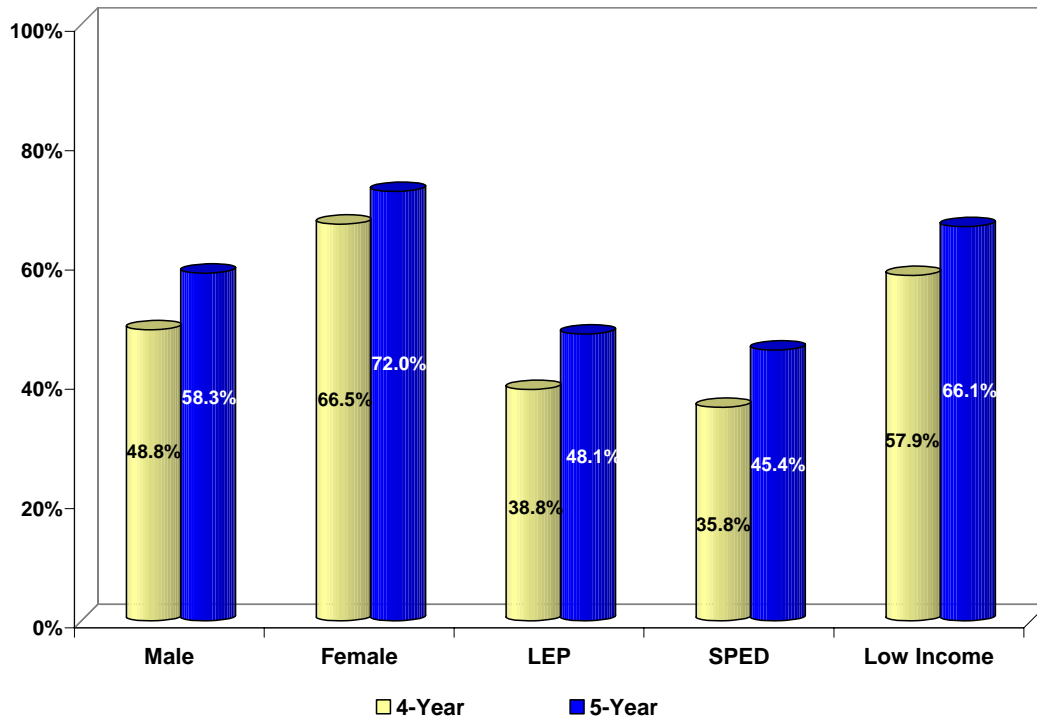
- With an additional year, the graduation rates for every racial/ethnic group in the 2007 cohort increased. The additional year seems most beneficial to Hispanic students, who saw a 9 point increase (140 students) in their 5-year graduation rate, compared to the 4-year rate; Black students experienced a gain of 8.1 points (173 students); Asian students gained 4.5 points (20 students); and White students gained 4.4 points (32 students).

Cohort 2007 (N=4,940)** 4-Year vs 5-Year Graduation Rate By Other NCLB Student Groups



- An additional year in high school benefited both male and female students: the 5-year graduation rate for males in the 2007 cohort increased by 9.5 percentage points compared to the 4-year rate. Similarly, female students saw a 5.5 point increase in their graduation rate with the additional year.
- Of the 973 SPED students who were part of the 2007 cohort, 348 students (35.8%) graduated in 4 years. An additional 93 SPED students graduated after staying in school an extra year, resulting in the 45.4% 5-year graduation rate. The 5-year rate for Limited English Proficient students was up 9.3 points (73 students); and was up 8.2 points for low income students (319 students).

- With an additional year in high school, the percentage of students who graduated increased across all high schools. The increases ranged from 17.9 percentage points at Boston International High, to 1.4 percentage points at O'Bryant. Every student at Health Careers graduated within five years.
