


- With an additional year, the graduation rate for students who entered high school as freshmen in 2006 (the 2010 Cohort) increased 5.6 percentage points, from 63.2% (4-year graduation rate) to 68.8% (5-year graduation rate). The increase represents an additional 274 members of the 2010 cohort graduating from the BPS after an extra year in school.
- The 2010 cohort 5-year rate increased by 2.3 percentage points when compared to the 2009 cohort 5-year rate of 66.5% and is the highest 5-year graduation rate since the 5-year rate was reported for the first time for the 2006 cohort.

Cohort 2010 (N=4,885)** 4-Year vs 5-Year Graduation Rate By Race/Ethnicity




- All racial/ethnic groups had higher 2010 5-year rates as compared the 2010 4-year rates. The additional year seems most beneficial to Black and Hispanic students, with each group seeing a 6.3 point and 6.0 point increase respectively (123 Black and 104 Hispanic students) in their 5-year graduation rate compared to the 4-year rate; Asian students experienced a gain of 4.8 points (22 students); and White students gained 4.0 points (26 students).
- While gaps in the graduation rates among the racial/ethnic groups remain, the additional year did narrow the difference between Black and White students from 13.8 percentage points at the end of four years to 11.5 percentage points after five years, and reduce the margin between Hispanic and White students from 17.6 percentage points at the end of four years to 15.6 percentage points after five years.

- An additional year in high school benefited both male and female students: the 5-year graduation rate for males in the 2010 cohort increased by 6.4 percentage points compared to the 4-year rate. Similarly, female students saw a 4.8 point increase in their graduation rate with the additional year.
- Of the 912 English language learners (ELL) students who were part of the 2010 cohort, 486 students (53.3%) graduated in 4 years. An additional 88 ELL students graduated after staying in school an extra year, resulting in the 62.9% 5-year graduation rate. The 5-year rate for students receiving special education services was up 7.7 points (75 students); and was up 6.2 points for low income students (255 students).
- Of all student groups, ELL students benefited the most with an additional year in high school: their 5-year graduation rate was up 9.6 percentage points, higher than any other group compared to the 4-year rate.

- With an additional year in high school, the percentage of students who graduated increased for all schools. The increases ranged from 20 percentage points at Boston International High to 1.1 points at Media Tech High School.
- In 2012, the 5-Year graduation rate target for both state and federal accountability purposes is 80% applied to the 2010 Cohort. Based on the 5-year rate, 12 high schools have met this requirement. However, only Urban Science high school would benefit from the 5-year rate because the other 10 have also met the 2012 4-year rate target of 75%.
