July 2022 Entering Kindergarten Math Calendar

Day 1 Start a summer collection! Find some rocks, shells, leaves, or other objects you like. Find ways to sort them. Draw a picture of your collection.	Day 2 Clap your hands or stomp your feet to show how old you are. Say the number to go along with each clap or stomp.	Day 3 Make a picture using circles and triangles. Explain to a friend how you used shapes to make your picture.	Day 4 Go on a "shape walk." Find as many squares, circles, triangles and rectangles you can around your house and yard. Draw some of the things you see.	Day 5 Play "I Spy," using terms beside, inside, next to, close to, above, below, apart. One player names an object and asks the other player to name the object and another object in relation to it.
Day 6 Trace your hand on paper. Cut it out. Find something that is smaller, bigger, and the same length as your hand. Record.	Day 7 Before you eat your snack today, count how many pieces you have. Eat one. How many do you have now?	Day 8 Use sidewalk chalk to create a hopscotch course. Play. Count as you land on the numbers.	Day 9 Write your first name. Count how many letters are in each? Can you write the number of letters in your name?	Day 10 Have an adult count how many times can you jump on one foot? Two feet?
Day 11 Look around the room. How many red objects can you find in your house?	Day 12 Draw a picture of your family from youngest to oldest.	Day 13 Play a board game. You can use and decorate the board game attached to the calendar.	Day 14 Name all of the colors in your shirt. How many colors are in your shirt?	Day 15 Draw 2 different sized circles. Color the biggest circle red and the smallest circle green.
Day 16 Make a picture using 2 circles, 3 triangles, & 1 rectangle. Explain to a friend how you made it.	Day 17 Name all of the colors you are wearing today.	Day 18 Take a square walk. Look for items shaped like a square. What are they?	Day 19 Predict how many spoonfuls it will take to finish your cereal. Count each spoonful as you eat.	Day 20 Grab a handful of cereal or grapes. Count how many pieces of cereal or grapes in your handful.
Day 21 Set the table for supper. Put out enough plates and utensils for each person	Day 22 Add to your summer collection! What did you add? Draw a picture of what you added to your collection.	Day 23 Pick two objects in your house. Describe them using words such as long, short, tall, heavy, light, big, small, wide, narrow.	Day 24 Sort socks while helping with laundry. Match socks by color and by size and put pairs together. Count how many pairs of each color and size?	Day 25 Start with 5 pieces of food at snack time (cereal, pasta, beans, chips, fruit, vegetables etc.) Eat 2. How many do you have left? Can you draw a picture to show how many you have left?
