



Frequently Asked Questions for Teachers and School Leaders (1/4)

<p>1. Will PARCC be used for accountability measures this year?</p>	<p>No, PARCC is in “pilot” mode until the 2015-2016 school year. DESE recognizes that this is a transition year and thus, PARCC schools will be held harmless in 2014-2015¹. School accountability ratings can only improve or remain constant – they cannot decline. Despite being held-harmless in 2014-2015, the results should still be used to identify potential teaching development areas and to address student needs for the following year.</p> <p>¹This provision does not apply to Level 4 schools. The Commissioner maintains the discretion to designate these schools as Level 5 regardless of the assessment administered.</p>
<p>2. If I’m taking the paper-version of PARCC this year, should I still incorporate technology into my classroom and instruction?</p>	<p>Yes, while there will be a paper and pencil option this year, it will not be offered next year (unless accommodations are necessary). To prepare for next year, it is best to incorporate technology into learning today. In addition, usage of technology will not just prepare students for PARCC, but for college and career readiness.</p>

If so, is there a list/repository of practice questions?</p>	<p>Yes, please navigate to http://parcconline.org/samples/item-task-prototypes (contains sample questions) and http://www.parcconline.org/practice-tests (contains sample tests).</p> <p>In addition, we will work with our Office of Engagement to supply all schools with toolkits that school leaders and teachers can use this Fall to help families and students know what to expect.</p>
<p>4. Who is involved with the PARCC planning?</p>	<p>We are working with the Boston Teachers Union and Network Superintendents to ensure teachers and principals are included in our PARCC planning and preparation efforts. In addition to school leaders and teachers, we are working with our Academic, Technology, and Data & Accountability central office teams. Lastly, we are engaging our Student Advisory Council to ensure the needs of students are heard.</p> <p>We have been preparing for PARCC (and, more specifically, Common Core standards) for several years and have adjusted our entire approach to curriculum and instruction so our students can be ready to succeed -- not just on an assessment, but in college, career, and life.</p>

When will the tests take place?</p>	<p>As of September 2014: The tentative schedule is as follows:</p> <p>PBA (computer) March 16-April 10 PBA (paper) March 23-April 3 EOY (computer) May 4-29 EOY (paper) May 11-22</p> <p>Note: Schools have the discretion of when to administer PARCC within the above time frame</p>
<p>11. How long is each session supposed to last?</p>	<p>PARCConline.org has provided great information on how long the tests should be administered for - by grade, subject, and test type (PBA vs. EOY). Please see http://parcconline.org/update-session-times for details of each session.</p>
<p>12.
